

Welcome to the Fox Cities Performing Arts Center!

When entering the Fox Cities Performing Arts Center, remember to **show respect for others and your environment** so everyone can fully enjoy and participate in the experience.

- During the performance, the performers can see and hear you, so give them your full attention.
 Unlike a video, we can not rewind and replay a scene if we miss it.

- Important things to remember:
 - Student backpacks, gum, drinks and food are not allowed in the theater.
 - Cell phones should be turned off and stowed.
 - Note that recording or taking photos in the theater is strictly prohibited; however, photos may be taken in the lobby.
 - It's a long way down please do not drop items off balconies.

Be prepared to arrive early

 You should plan on arriving to the Center 20 minutes before the show. Allow for travel time, parking and trips to the restroom.



Health and Safety

- The Center has created a touchless experience with the Evolv Express Security System. Upon entry, all bags entering the building are subject to search and prohibited items will not be allowed.
- Teachers and chaperones are discouraged from bringing bags, however, necessary backpacks or bags may be searched and tagged before being allowed in the theater.
- We ask that students leave their backpacks at school for Amcor Education Series performances. However, if students do bring them, they are subject to search and will need to be checked at the registration table in the lobby upon entry.

About the show

Dot Dot: A New Musical is an exciting new musical based on the Creatrilogy trio of award-winning picture books by New York Times bestselling author Peter H. Reynolds — "The Dot," "Ish" and "Sky Color." The musical, like the series, celebrates the power of originality, self-expression, and opening our eyes to look beyond the expected.

When Marisol ("Sky Color"), a young artist and curator of the Musee de Marisol, decides that her gallery requires more than her own art, her search for emerging talent leads her to Vashti ("The Dot"), whose dots inspire Ramon ("Ish") to become an artist in his own right. The musical follows Marisol's journey to help her new friends and her community, break free from self-criticism and learn to let their imaginations soar.

Lesson One

Objective: Students will expand on their artistic creativity by creating a piece of art based on a dot.

Materials:

- "The Dot" by Peter H. Reynolds
- The handout with a dot printed on it (page 6 of this guide)
- Coloring utensils

Activity:

- Read "The Dot" by Peter H. Reynolds with your class.
- Discuss Vashti's art process. How did her art evolve throughout the book?
- Hand out the sheet with the dot on it. Ask your students: Vashti's art project started with a single dot on a page, and then she started creating dots of all sorts and colors. Can you expand upon this dot to create something new?
- Let your students have time to create their new pieces of art, don't forget when they're finished to have them sign it, just like Vashti!

Closing Discussion: What have you learned about art? Is it different for everyone? Was it hard to create something new out of a dot?

Pid You Know?

Did you know that Peter H. Reynolds does more than just write children's stories? He is also an illustrator! You may have seen his work in stories written by Megan McDonald ("Judy Moody," "Stink") and Susan Verde ("The Museum," "The 'I Am' Series") as well as books written by his twin brother Paul A. Reynolds! Not only is Peter H. Reynolds an illustrator, he has created short animated films as well! One film, written by both Peter H. and Paul A. Reynolds is called "Keepers of the Flame" and is a tribute to teachers and their important role in inspiring and nurturing their students. Links to the videos can be found on the resource page (12).

Lesson Two

Objective: In the book "Ish," Ramon explores "ish" words to create poetry. Utilizing the biographical poem template, your students will create a poem about themselves!

Materials:

- "Ish" by Peter H. Reynolds
- Writing utensils
- Bio poem handout

Guiding Questions: Ramon explores many different ways to be creative, from drawing to writing. Did you know that you can create a poem just by describing yourself?

Activity:

- Read "Ish" by Peter H. Reynolds
- Discuss with your class what "ish" drawings are. How do we make "ish" into words? How can poetry be made up of "ish" words?
- Handout sheets of the bio poem template. Today, you are going to create a poem about yourself!
 - You may need to review what descriptive words are and provide some examples. You can even play with "ish" words like "creativish," "daringish," etc.

Closing Discussion: Is it easy to create poetry? What did you learn about yourself from writing this poem?

In The Spotlight

Author of the books "Ish," "Sky Color" and "The Dot," also known as the "Creatiology" is Peter H. Reynolds. Born in Toronto, Canada, Reynolds is an accomplished writer, storyteller and illustrator whose books have been shared all around the globe. His book, "The Dot" has now been published in over 20 languages, including Braille and is an award-winning book. In 2009, International Dot Day was created by an Iowa-based educator to celebrate creativity, courage and collaboration. Over 189 countries have participated in International Dot Day, on September 15, to date.
